Admiral Nurse Dementia Service



Over the past 12 months, our **Admiral Nurse Dementia** Service has made fantastic progress in supporting those living with dementia and their families. A key highlight has been the expansion of our dementia groups to Barrow, where we are now delivering weekly sessions to provide much-needed support. We've also launched Sporting **Memories and Woodland** Wellness in Barrow, offering participants the chance to enjoy the outdoors with activities such as visits to local sports stadiums and a game of bowls in the park. Additionally, the exciting launch of the Furness **Dementia Partnership has** strengthened our work, enabling us to collaborate closely with other community organisations, sharing resources and ideas. Our growing team is looking forward to expanding services across the South Lakes in the coming year.
